

CROWD AT RACES

Good Sport at Washington Park Fails to Attract Turf Followers.

MAY CALL THE MEETING OFF

Scarcity of Horses the Cause—Hildreth's Burleigh Wins a Fast Race.

Howe racing without being put to test at Washington Park yesterday. Without the glamour of a Derby to attract turf followers a true census of those who are willing to pay a dollar to see a horse race was afforded. They are talking of going elsewhere, and if this should be the case the club will be forced to close the gates. The discharge of some of the employees sent out to the report that the meeting would be discontinued was also the fact that the races have been cut from six to five today.

Burleigh ran the fastest six furlongs of the local racing season today, the fifth race, covering the distance in 1:32.4. He ran like a streak in the first half of the race, but bumped the rest of the way and was pulled to a canter.
