

TROPHY TO GUPHILL

Minnesota Marksman Wins
Grand American Handi-
cap and Big Prizes.

SHOOT HAS CLOSE FINISH

W. Randal of Colorado Ties the
Score Three Times Be-
fore Losing.

INDIA POLICE, June 22—With a throng of enthusiastic crowds about the lines and in what was probably the most exciting finish ever witnessed in a Grand American handicap tournament, Richard L. Guphill of Atkinson, Minn., handicapped at eleven yards won the Grand American trophy, a silver tea service and \$1,000 in prize money, the third year in a row, by defeating William Randall of Telluride, Colo., a sixty-six break.

The wind blowing across the water offered the contestants natural handicap, with which the guns had had to contend during the shooting of the previous days.
