

SEEKS OPINION
ON CAMPAIGN
ORDINANCE

Betkowski to Ask Legal Department to Decide Whether Such Law Could Be Enforced

When the ordinance regulating the expenditure of funds for campaign purposes is called before the public welfare committee of the council tomorrow, City Attorney Stephens will be asked by Councilman Betkowski to decide if the Dunlop-Read ordinance can be enforced if it is adopted.

The chief deputy in the city attorney's office, Howard Robertson, has already handed down an informal decision, stating that the provisions of the ordinance are inconsistent, and that in his opinion its passage would be unwise.

"I believe it would be a rank piece of foolishness to pass the ordinance and I shall vote against it," said Councilman Betkowski.

"It evidently was Mr. Dunlop's intention to prevent any one interested in an election campaign to spend any money for campaign literature, cards, or to hire any employees to work for a candidate or a measure for a period of 30 days preceding an election."

The ordinance also provides that anyone who has worked for money in the interests of a candidate or a measure for thirty days before an election cannot contribute their services to another section day.

"In another section the hiring of automobiles or other conveyances to take voters to the polls is prohibited.

"It is my belief that it is automobile to take my own wife to the polls to cast her vote for me at an election it would be deemed an infraction of the law," he said. "I will, however, shall ask the City Attorney to show just how foolish the law is," concluded Councilman Betkowski.

He is endeavoring to obtain members of the council to entertain the same view of the ordinance and will oppose its passage.

Prince Chamay Is Pneumonia Victim

BRUSSELS, Oct. 13—Prince Joseph De Carman Chimay, deserted husband of Clara Ward, the Detroit, Mich., heiress, died here today of pneumonia. Prince Chimay and Clara Ward were married in 1890. Four years later the Princess eloped with Rigo, a gipsy violin player, from whom she was later divorced. The Princess is now suing her third husband for divorce.
