**ST. PAUL RAILWAY NOW
USING \$1,000,000 BRIDGE**

The gigantic bridge of the St. Paul railway over the Des Moines River, located between Madrid and Woodward, has been put into operation. The bridge will be the largest of its kind in the country and the highest double-track railroad bridge in the country. The structure was made necessary to complete the work of line tracking begun by the railroad two years ago. It cost \$1,000,000. Disabled Spokane Arrives Safe
in Port with All Her Passengers and Cargo

Oct. 6.—Here is the very latest from the Long Champs race course, where fashions are made and races are run. The girls are now more corsets—that is, the lady is to follow the lead of the smart set. Here are some of the fashionable oddities which are "the thing" today, as they were introduced at the Grand Prix Sunday:

The Grand Prix was the first big style making event since July and was attended by scores of rich American tourists, some of whom will carry the new fashions home. The classic race was regarded only as an incident.

SEATTLE, Oct. 6.—With all of her passengers and crew aboard and cargo intact save from water damage, the Pacific Coast Company's Chilean steamer Spokane, Capt. C. H. White, came into port under her own steam. The vessel is said to be lying at the bottom of the off the coast of Mukilteo, appears due to the heroism of Chief Engineer, J. C. Dumett and his brave assistants.

The accident to the ship was caused by a piece of wood from the sea opening the condenser valve.

With the intention of getting the vessel back to port as soon as it was but a short time until the engineers were working in water waist deep.

One man and three or four men fell or jumped into the water in their attempts to get into the life boats or on the life rafts, but all were picked up. The ship is being repaired and remains there until taken back aboard the Spokane. At 3:30 o'clock Saturday morning the ship was clear of water and the passengers were taken aboard again from the beach and the La Touche.
