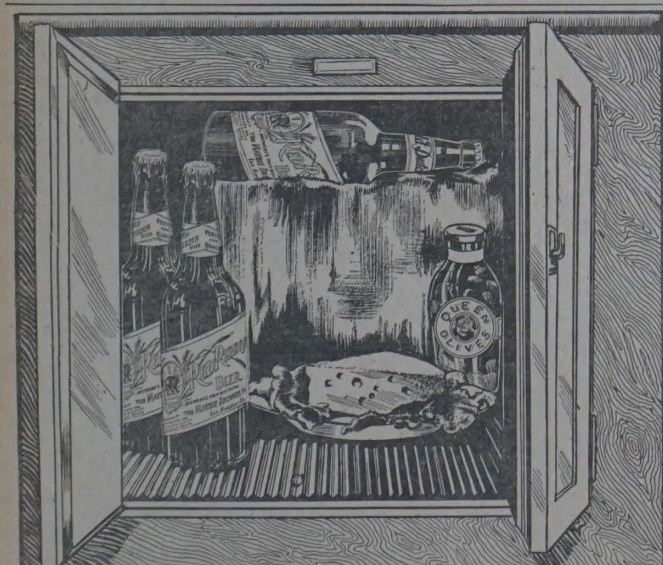

IOWAN NABS MAN WHO SOLD STATUE

Waits Two Weeks in Chicago
Railway Station for Seller of
Logan Monument

CHICAGO, Oct. 6.—The vigil of Pathias Kingsdale, an Iowa farmer, who for weeks has watched in the vicinity of the Illinois Central station for the return of the man who sold him the Logan monument in Grant Park, was rewarded. Kingsdale saw the person he accuses of swindling him enter the building and pounced upon him, calling for the police. The prisoner was identified as William Woodward.

The Iowa paid \$450 for the huge bronze likeness of the General and was discussing with a gang of workmen the best way to take it down when a park policeman came on the scene. Kingsdale went to Pennsylvania for a few weeks' stay. On his return here fourteen days ago he asserted he would send until he found the confidence man.

SAVES MOTHER AT FIRE BY BLOWING TOY HORN

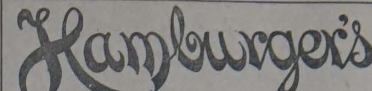
