

ROMANIAN UNITE TO AID COUNTRYMEN

People Who Seek New Homes
in Southwest to Receive
Help at Start

A representative number of leading Romanian Jewish business and professional men have united for the purpose of organizing a permanent society for aiding and assisting their countrymen in need of aid of every conceivable nature.

Owing to the great persecution which existed, and still exists, in their mother country, many of their fellow countrymen emigrate to the United States and scatter throughout this country. With the opening of the Panama canal, many thousands of them will make their home along the Pacific coast. It is the aim and purpose of this organization to supply all newcomers with suitable employment so that they may not become a burden on the community at large. This society will inaugurate other departments of a charitable nature to aid the poorer class in the local community that are in temporary distress, with medical assistance and employment.

The society will hold a mass meeting next Sunday afternoon at Majestic hall, Majestic Theater building, to raise the necessary funds needed to carry out the benevolent policies of the organization.

As there are over 6000 Romanians in this city, a large attendance is anticipated.
