5000 ARE KILLED BY CHOLERA IN BALKANS

BUCHAREST, Roumania, Oct. 3.—Cholera is sweeping the Balkan states. The ravages of the two recent Balkan wars have left thousands of families homeless and starving. A large section of Albania is without doctors and medical supplies. In isolated districts hamlets and villages have been depopulated and the dead remain as they fell, with no one to bury them. It is estimated that at least 5000 have died of cholera. The disease was brought from Asia by the Turks.

FOUR BUILDINGS TO COST HALF MILLION

Prosperity in building operations has taken a new turn, for four new buildings, totaling half a million dollars have been announced.

The first of these will be an 11-story steel and concrete hotel, to be erected on the west side of Main street between Eighth and Ninth by Fred Glass of San Francisco.

The proposed St. Vincent's church will be erected at Adams and Figueroa streets, at a cost of a quarter of a million.

A \$100,000 fire proof brew house will be erected on Aliso street by the Maler Brewing company.

Walter H. Fisher will erect a three-story store and hotel building at Ninth street and Grand avenue at a cost of \$50,000.

JAIL BUNCO SUSPECT AFTER CHASE OF YEAR

Although failing to find the real suspect after a search of nearly a year, the Lieutenant of Detectives Leith of New York has arrested Frank Williams, known here as "Mr. Price" and to the police of two continents as "McGee, alias Morrison," an alleged bunco man.

The arrest, according to Leith, partially breaks up a bunco gang, but the leader escaped and the detective stated today that he had now little hope of capturing him at present.

"Williams was part of a mob of bunco men who robbed the Meridian bank, Walker, of \$100,000 two years ago," said Leith. "His partner, whose name I am suppressing, was also engaged in that affair. The others are serving time in a Connecticut prison."

"Williams was arrested in the office of Harry Brodski at Redondo. Brodski was instrumental in breaking up a Chicago gang of bunco men. I do not think Williams operated here, but he was preparing to. Within a few weeks he would have had a dozen other men in the city and a campaign of swindling would have been under way."

CITY C. E. TO ELECT OFFICERS TONIGHT

The city Christian Endeavor convention will have its most important session this evening, when the election of officers will take place.

Dr. John Talcom Shaw, new pastor of the Immanuel Presbyterian church and trustee of the United Society of Christian Endeavor, will deliver the convention address.

The convention was opened last night in the First Christian church, Eleventh and Hope streets, with the tenth annual banquet. Seventy-nine societies were represented and 200 sat down to the banquet.

Addresses were made by C. Donald Youngster, president of the convention of the hospital board of the city union, and F. D. H. Moots.

Three short speeches, grouped under the head of "Christian Endeavor Work," were made by Rev. Ed. Campbell, Rev. Herbert Fisher and Rev. J. Clarence Pinkerton.

15 Injured by Fall and Church Panic

NEW YORK, Oct. 2.—Wild scenes of panic were enacted in a synagogue at 42 East 100th street today when a balcony crowded with worshippers collapsed during a New Year's service.

Men, women and children were precipitated in a heap on the seats and floor. The rabbi joined with the uninjured members of the congregation in helping the wounded.

Physicians were summoned from Mount Sinai and the J. Hood Wright hospitals. They found that 15 persons had been injured by the fall of the balcony.

Scores of others were bruised and trampled upon when they fought to escape in the belief that the entire building was collapsing.

Wilson to Stump Against Senators

WASHINGTON, Oct. 2.—The Senate took up the Glass currency bill today, but action cannot be hoped for inside of three weeks.

Reports that President Wilson is planning to take the stump to force the Senate to pass the Glass-Owen currency measure were unconfirmed at the White House today. The President certainly will make a vigorous plea for the bill in his address before the southern Commerce congress at Mobile on October 23.

He still has hopes of being able to influence such Senators as Hitchcock or Nebraska, Reed of Missouri and O'Gorman of New York, who are antagonistic to the measure, and will appeal over their heads to their constituents only as a last resort.
