Fifteen Year-Old Lad Is the Leader of Seventy Strikers.


Western Union messenger boys are on strike again. Following a three-cent reduction in delivery rates about three weeks ago, practically the entire force, amounting to about 70, this morning walked out, refusing to deliver messages and deliver to second-class mailboxes for any boys who attempted to take their place.

Following the walkout at the main office on Mason and adjacent thoroughfares, the boys marched on the beachfront in a body and announced their number considerably by boys employed at the branches.

Street fights, the usual sequence to messenger boy strikes, were frequent early in the day, although not serious. Jackson, Mich. Militant Arrested in Riot in London.

LONDON, March 9.—Militant suffragettes engaged in a battle with the police during an anti-warrior rally at Trafalgar square. The arrest of Sylvia Pankhurst for the sixth time under the "cat and mouse" law, precipitated this incident. In addition to Miss Pankhurst, seven women and three men were arrested.

Among those taken into custody was Miss Sylvia Emerson of Jackson, Mich. Miss Emerson has been arrested several times for participation in the anti-warrior movement and recently it was rumored that she would be deported from the British government to expel her from the country as an undesirable alien. Pankhurst, P. D. in a meeting held in the house of Commons on 6th inst. declared that the force necessary to declare no such steps were being taken. He added:

61,000 LOST FOUND ON ARSON SUSPECT

Sixty Gold Watches, Stolen From Depot, in His Rooms.

Sixty new gold watches, valued at nearly \$3,000, stolen from the Michigan Central railroad depot here, 2 1/2 last, were recovered in the room of Harry Levine, 125 Elizabeth street, yesterday, following his arrest on suspicion of setting fire to his home at 200 Hastings street. Fourteen other watches stolen from C. P. Green, a traveling salesman for an eastern jewelry house, also were recovered in the room of Harry Levine. The total value of the timepieces was nearly \$3,000. Levine told the police he hid them at his place.

Detective Patrick also found in Levine's room two large trunks filled with gold goods. Levine said that these came from his second-hand store, at 125 Elizabeth street. He told the police that the stock in his Hastings street store was worth \$10,000, and admitted that the place was insured for \$20,000.

The police and fire marshal have not completed their investigation of the fire, which broke out at 2 1/2 last Sunday. Levine gave the police the names of the men he met in his Hastings street watch store and said the men will be captured.
