NEW WINDSOR DOCK OPENED BY WILCOX

James A. Reid, 14 Years With C. P. R., Named Dockmaster
After Ceremonies.

James A. Reid, 14 Oak avenue, Windsor, who has been in the employ of the Canadian Pacific Railway company for 14 years, was appointed to the position of permanent dock in Windsor, which was opened Thursday afternoon by Col. W. H. Wilcox, president of the Essex. The appointment was announced by the manager after he had concluded his speech.

"I have had to deal with 32 applicants for the position," he said. "By appointing Mr. Reid publicly, I want to give the public the success of the applicant's experience with the Canadian Pacific and the fact that the recommendation to the government."

Mr. Reid has been a member of the association of leaders in the west end of Windsor since he took up residence there. He said that more than 300 letters of recommendation were sent to the government on behalf of the executives of the party were unanswered.

The new dock is the best appointed along the Detroit river and is the largest ever constructed last year under the supervision of Col. W. H. Wilcox, president of the Allied armies in France. It cost \$15,000 and is of reinforced concrete.

Its length is 65 feet, large enough to accommodate the largest boats in the great lakes. In the center is a warehouse of fireproof construction, 20 x 30 feet, which will be used by dockmaster and customs officers. The dock will be dredged to give 20 feet of water.

The opening was under the auspices of Col. W. H. Wilcox and more than 300 men attended a luncheon before the speeches.
