TWO TRAINS CANCELLED.

CHICAGO, Nov. 4.—Despite the announcement of U. S. Control purchasing agent for Northwestern railroads, that his agencies are supplied with coal for 37 days, the Northwestern line today cancelled two trains. Other roads were said to be considering this method of conservation.

The regional coal committee here today revised its figures, as to Chicago's coal reserve. There will be no pinching for at least 10 days it is said. A 20-day supply was the previous estimate.

In Chicago, individual operators and industrial concerns, when quoted, predicted normal coal production will not be in sight within a month. They predicted settlement by arbitration, with miners obtaining wage increases in line with advances in the cost of living.
