\$8.58 to Schmid and Shadwick for expenses already has been allowed by the court and other creditors have been notified to file their claims now or before May 8. A hearing on claims will be held May 20 in district court.

## Many Delays.

Thomas and his wife, who fled Minneapolis one year ahead of indictments voted by the grand jury, were arrested in Chicago and first arraigned August 31, 1937. Goff sent an extradition request to the office of Governor Horner of Illinois, and an extradition hearing was set for September 23.

The hearing was continued until October 8, and further delays held up the trial until Feb. 10, when Horner granted extradition to Minneapolis on the swindling charges with charges of promoting a lottery dropped.

An extradition warrant was served on the Thomases March 8, and they fought back with a writ of habeas corpus that brought more delays, and, finally, their release Wednesday.

on the urgent advice of such progressive counselors as the CIO's legal expert, Lee Pressman, and E. L. Oliver, vice chairman of Labor's Non-Partisan League. These men, all strong left-wing liberals, all essentially intellectuals, profoundly disliked the old vote-auctioning and political intimidation by which American labor has always, hitherto, meagerly attained its ends. They longed for independent, forthright and progressive action, and, after some persuasion, got Mr. Lewis to see things their way.

It is especially significant that the intention of the CIO's progressive counselors is frankly to imitate the British Labor party. They have no patience with the argument that there can never be a Labor party in America because this is a middle-class country. They believe that their Labor party can attract all progressive groups, and, in a handbook prepared for neophyte politicians in the labor movement by Mr. Oliver's league, they warn against too narrow a concentration on the labor vote.

"Since organized labor is seldom a numerical majority in any community," says the handbook rather drily, "to win, it must have the support of other elements in the population. It is not difficult to demonstrate that the interests of so-called middle-class voters—professionals, small merchants, etc.—are, on analysis, identical with those of organized labor."

## THE FUTURE.

THE "professionals, small merchants, etc." may not be won over so easily as the handbook suggests they can. Nevertheless, whether Mr. Kennedy gets or fails to get the Democratic nomination for Pennsylvania's governorship, labor will come out of the campaign with a machine of its own. The machine will have nothing to do with Senator Guffey, who is tagging somewhat sadly alone more in the hope of beating his rebellious subordinates than for any other reason. It will have nothing to do with anyone but the leaders of labor.

The American Labor party is already organized in New York. The example of Pennsylvania will undoubtedly inspire it to a new self-assertiveness in its first state. And with a Labor party in New York and Pennsylvania, the two largest states in the union, Mr. Lewis and his progressive friends will have traveled a long distance toward their goal of a national, independent organization.



## LATEST IN SOUND DEVICES DISPLAYED

Science's latest advances in the field of sound amplification and reproduction, housed in a special railroad car at the Milwaukee station, Thursday were viewed by Minneapolis school children and businessmen.

The car is on a 7,000-mile tour of the nation and was sent out from the laboratories of the RCA-Victor Co. It is appearing in Minneapolis through arrangement with the Locker Sales Co.

Display Sound Projector.

Among the equipment on display is a device consisting of two loudspeakers which can direct sound for great distances with the accuracy of a searchlight beam.

In this way spoken words can be aimed at a certain small spot at a distance of several over a wide area. The equipment can be used for direct fire fighting, to patrol beaches to supervise rescue work at sea, to communicate between ships and docks and for outdoor gatherings.

Device Permits 'Seeing' Voice.

Another device is the cathode ray oscillograph which permits one to see the characteristics of the voice or other sound in varying wave forms on a luminescent screen. An electron multiplier also was displayed.

With this apparatus music is transmitted over a beam of light and when perfected is expected to make possible big improvements in motion picture and radio. Several other recent laboratory developments also were on view.

Munn, chairman of the state AAA committee, and Governor Benson also will speak.
