





U.P. BREWERY NOW HISTORY

Marquette's distinctive old brewery has been toppled to make way for progress. The 90-year-old landmark that caught the eye of every tourist passing the Washington Street site was demolished this spring to make way for the modern Detroit and Northern Savings Bank.

Officials of the bank, along with local citizens, sought to salvage the famous brownstone castle, but finally, the tower was deemed unsafe for use.

George Rueblien, the original owner, came here from Germany in August 1849. Marquette was only one month old. Several years later he cleared a farm on the old plank road to Negaunee. He built a brewery just east of Dead Man's Curve, on the straight stretch of what is now Highway 492.

Reublien advertised in 1869 that his Franklin Brewery would deliver to any station on the line of the Marquette and Ontonagon Railroad.

In June 1872, the location on Washington Street, at Highway 41, was chosen and construction of the new brewery began. Situated on a five-acre tract just outside Marquette's city limits, Reublien held the grand opening on Dec. 13, 1873. Reublien directed the landscaping of the property and opened spacious summer gardens to the public in June 1875.

A brass band announced the opening from the music stand. Private police patrolled the broad avenues to insure strict order, with "no" vicious or ungentlemanly conduct." The women admired the many shade trees and bright summer flowers. They strolled across welltended lawns, through the 10 lattice summer houses, and picnicked with their families in the shelter hall.

The brewery now consisted of eight buildings. Two large houses were constructed for married workers. Single men boarded in the owner's home.

Reublien spent \$800 a year on labor to haul ice from Lake Superior to cool the beer. A large ice house kept the ice frozen year around.

In 1875, the name of the brewery changed to Concordis. Citizens simply called it "the Burey."

Its capacity was 15,000 barrels a year. The Depression which spread to most areas a few years previously was finally felt, and production was cut to 5,000 barrels.

Milwaukee breweries also brought pressure on the smaller plants. There was stiff competition, and Reublien was finally forced to close the plant in the spring of 1878.

Now "the Honorable Peter White" owned the brewery.

Charles Meeske of Milwaukee signed a three-year lease to the Concordia plant, and brought in Reiner Hoch as partner. Meeske, a native of Swinemunde, Germany, was the son of a brewery owner. His years as foreman of an Oshkosh brewery further qualified him for the job. They had the plant operating again by March 1879.



The next winter, the stream running through the property was dammed, forming a "mineral well" with the spring nearby. The workmen were set to cutting ice right on the property. The spring water was also used in making the beer.

In 1882, Meeske and Hoch purchased the plant from White. Four years later they changed the name of the plant to "Upper Peninsula Brewing Company." Their Drei Kaiser beer, labels showing with three fat jolly kings toasting with high mugs of brew, sold the length of the UP.

In 1890 the brewers added the magnificent turrets and stained glass windows to the upper floors of the main building. They hung a large chandelier in the office.

Construction of new buildings continued, including ice houses three stories high and spacious cellars underneath. A dance pavilion, cooper shop for barrel-making, and a two-story wash house 90-feet deep were added in 1906.



U.P. BREWERY NOW HISTORY (cont'd)

In October 1910, a new building of brownstone was erected across the road from the bottling works. It carried out the Castle-on-the-Rhine theme, as did the main building. It, along with one of the storage buildings, is the only structure still standing.

In 1913, the name Drei Kaiser became unpopular as the threat of war with Germany boomed. The name was changed to Castle Brew.

Dr. D. P. Hornbogen, of Marquette, recalls sneaking into the cellars with his school friend, Carl Boswell, a relative of Meeske's. "We would sneak down after school and tap the kegs," he laughs.

Probation closed the plant in 1916. Numerous businesses have operated from the buildings since, the last occupant being a moving and storage company.

The brownstone crumbled and the cellars then caved in. This spring, huge cranes toppled the last turret.

New steel rises from the rubble as Detroit and Northern erect their new building. Marguette's old "burey" fell to progress.

BUSINESS AND PLEASURE

A group of master brewers consumed 158 cases of beer at their threeday convention in Hershey, Pa. Some 200 persons, including wives, attended the meeting of the Tri-District Master Brewers Association of America. Hershey Hotel officials said the \$4000 liquor bill also included 18 gallons of Bloody Marys.
